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Hi Bob,

It was very nice to see you onsite this morning! As we discussed, no ground disturbing activities can occur on Lots 9 and 10 until the project biologist (Tay Peterson or other MIG Biologist) has conducted a biological resources survey for woodrat nests, and nesting birds. This is in compliance with the project mitigation measures (BIO-2a and BIO-2b). I have attached the project Conditions of Approval (COA's) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan (MMRP) for you to reference. Please make sure to familiarize yourself with all COAs and Mitigation Measures for the project, as the County is inspecting the project for compliance with all of these measures.

In addition, please key-in the silt fence that lines the perimeter of the project, prior to ground disturbance. I know that you will be removing the check dams along the spill way, in order to construct the permanent spillway, but please make sure that all silt fence that is remaining onsite is properly installed. The proper installation of silt fence includes digging a trench along the bottom of the entire fenceline, and then burying the bottom of the fence into the dirt by at least 6 inches. I have attached the CASQA guidelines for silt fence installation, so that you have instructions to reference.
